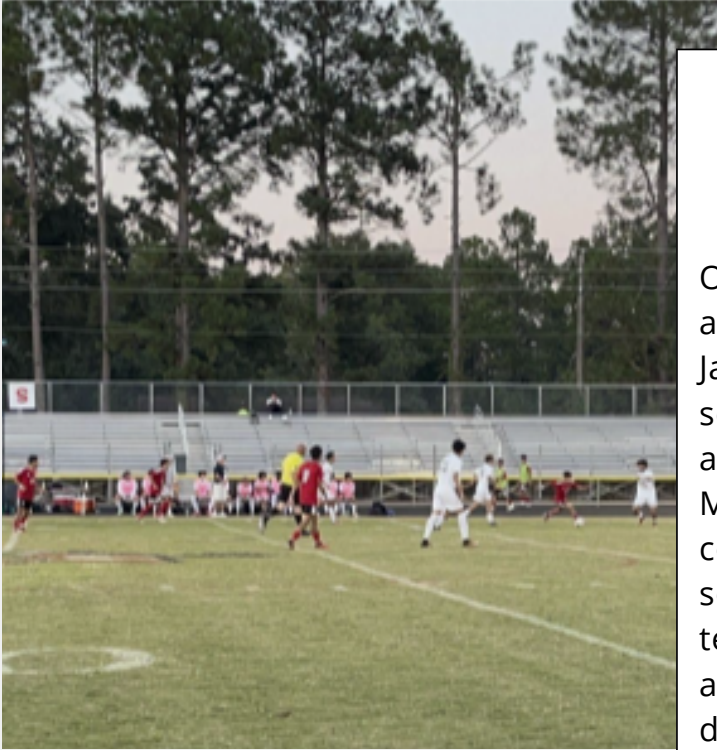
PRACTICE FOR COMPETITIONS

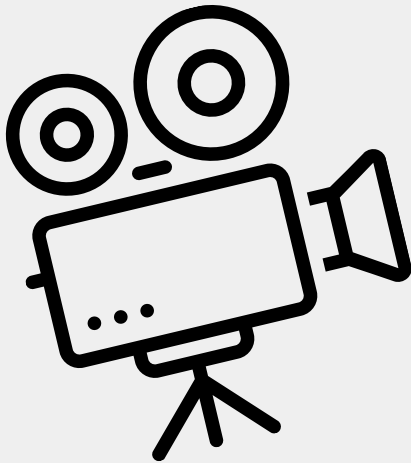

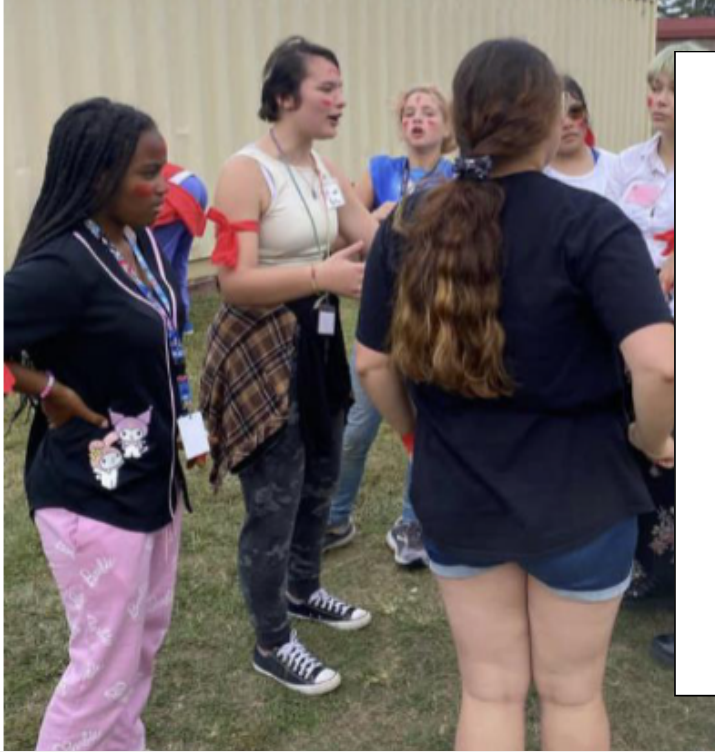

DRAMA CLUB CAPTURES THE FLAG

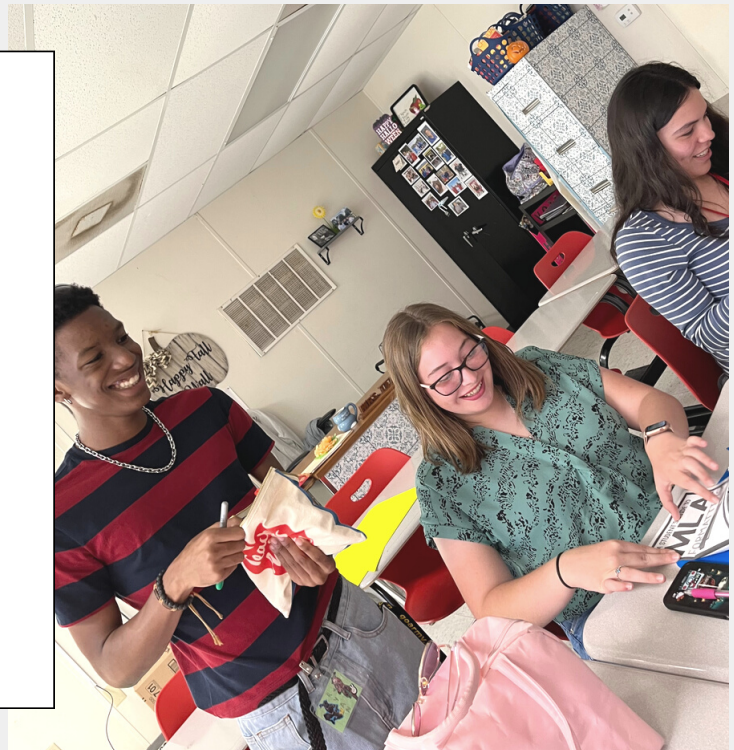

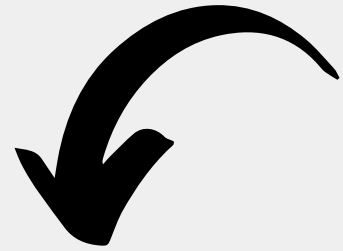


